Summerside Police Services 2021

Findings on compliance with Ministerial Directives.

Review conducted by Phil Pitts, Office of the Police Commissioner, on February 23, 2022 for the calendar year 2021 Summerside Police Services. Sgt. Jason Blaquaire presented the files for review.

<u>Appointment Records</u> – A total of six files reviewed. All six officers are full time. Three were hired pre-2010 and as such are grandfathered while the three hired since 2019 fall under the new security requirements.

Summary:

All recommendations from last year's review have been complied with.

Appointment

Overall there is an excellent level of documented compliance with Ministerial Directives concerning appointments. The three officers hired after the 2019Ministerial Directive on Security Clearance were all well documented and in compliance. It was also noted while they had been provided with the documents ie: Police Act, Code of Conduct, none of the three officers hired prior to 2010 had this documented on their files and while this is not required it is suggested that if they are provided with these it should be documented on their files.

Training

Overall there is an excellent level of documented compliance with Ministerial Directives with exceptions noted due to availability of close contact training due to COVID. These issues are hopefully behind us. It is recommended that this training be scheduled and undertaken as soon as possible in 2022 and be considered 2022 training.

Identification Cards

Officers are carrying their identification cards for production on demand as required.

Police Records Management System

Summerside Police Service provided a report completed in 2021. It indicates a quality assurance review was completed on their 2020 files by their records department and also that all corrective actions recommended in the 2020 OSR audit had been completed.

Recommendations:

- 1. That corrective action be taken to document on the files of the officers hired prior to 2010 that they have been provided with copies of the Police Act and Regulations, Code of Professional Conduct and Discipline, adopted Use of Force Model and Minister's Directives asap and that a review be undertaken of the files of those officers hired prior to 2010 and copies be provided to those that had not received them and this action be documented on their files.
- 2. That identified 2021 training shortcomings due to COVID be scheduled and undertaken as soon as possible in 2022 and be considered 2022 training.
